Adjournment of the «bore out» trial following an inconclusive decision

By decision dated July 27, 2016, the Paris Labor Court (Conseil de Prud'hommes) referred the examination of the case to a professional judge, following an inconclusive decision.

After Mr. Desnard was convicted for defamation against Interparfums in 2015, this decision contradicts his argument according to which, he was allegedly a victim of harassment.

Interparfums maintains its position, with its Chairman Philippe Benacin reaffirming that «Everything that Frederic Desnard has recounted constitutes a fabrication of untruths. He was received on multiple occasions and listened to with attention by his supervisory management and by myself directly, whereas he manifested a loss of interest in his functions. The company has absolutely no responsibility whatsoever for his personal situation.»
